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## Checklist for a German National Visa

- AU PAIR -

Persons aged 18 or over but under the age of 27 can apply for a visa to work as an au pair for a period of at least six months and not longer than twelve months. The aim of au-pair stays is to improve language skills and broaden horizons by getting to know the host country. Only one au-pair stay in Germany is possible.

Before booking an appointment, please prepare the following documentation for your visa. The following documents are to be submitted **personally** at the Embassy **after booking** an appointment.

## **IMPORTANT:**

- 1. Please provide the <u>original documents</u> in the **first (1.) pile** in the below mentioned order!
- 2. Please also provide two copies of all documents in two (2) identical piles!
- 3. The Embassy reserves the right to request additional documents.

## **DOCUMENTS:**

Fully completed and signed application form for "national visa" (here)
Where applicable: <u>Declaration</u> fully completed and signed regarding contact details and power of attorney
Valid passport (valid for at least 6 months and with at least two (2) completely empty pages)
Recent <b>biometric passport photos</b> (see specimen photos, other photos cannot be accepted and delay the visa process)
Completed <b>questionnaire of the Federal Employment Agency</b> filled out and signed by the host family (here)
<b>Signed au-pair contract</b> based on the specimen contract published by the Federal Employment Agency <a href="https://www.arbeitsagentur.de/datei/aupair-ver-trag-ba013161.pdf">https://www.arbeitsagentur.de/datei/aupair-ver-trag-ba013161.pdf</a> . Printout or fax copy will only be accepted if the au-pair post was offered through an agency with "RAL Gütezeichen" (Quality Mark)
Proof of adequate <b>financial means</b> (as a rule in the form of the au-pair contract)
Residence registration certificate of the guest family
